Music Genre of the Week

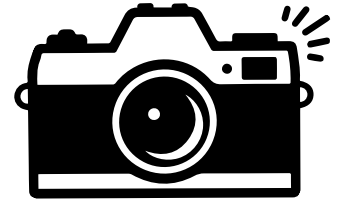
Rock & Roll

Mistakes teach us about organisation and planning. They help us to understand how to improve for the next time



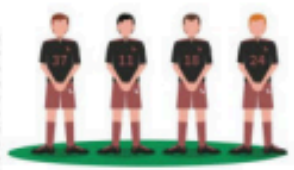
OBSTACLES

MYTH - CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE WON'T HAPPEN TO MY CHILD

TRUTH - ABUSE OCCURS AT EVERY SOCIOECONOMIC LEVEL, ALL ETHNICITIES, ALL FAMILY SIZES, ALL RELIGIONS AND ALL LEVELS OF EDUCATION.

Children don't talk about sexual abuse, so we have to. Over 90% of abuse is carried out by someone you know or known to the family. If you're worried about someone's behaviour with a child, or secretive use of chat rooms, social media platforms or illegal websites, the sooner you act the sooner you can prevent abuse from happening. If you suspect that someone you know may be sexually abusing a child, you must contact the police or speak confidentially to someone on the NSPCC Helpline.
