Fletcher D (Y1), for being kind to a friend who was feeling sad.

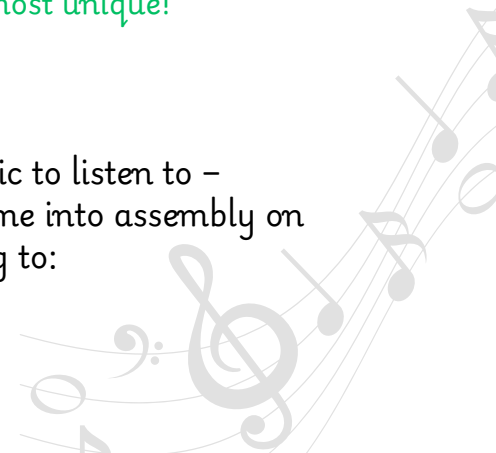
### Next Week's Marvellous Manners: **Read for pleasure to achieve your potential!**
